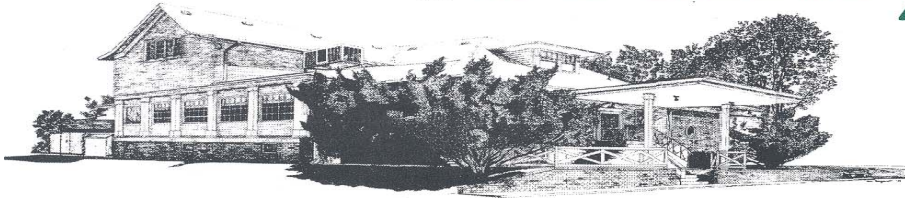
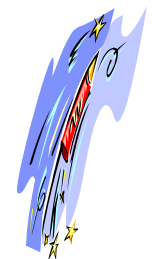
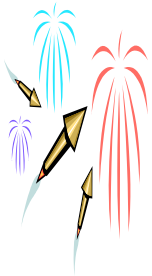

POOL RULES

1. Swimming pool opens Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day. The pool will open at 11:00 a.m. (12:00 on Sunday) if the temperature is 65 degrees or above (according to the Weather Channel) at 10:30 a.m. If not it will be checked again at 12:00 p.m. and if not it will be checked again at 3:30 p.m. If the temperature hasn't reached 65 degrees by 3:30 p.m. the pool will remain closed for the day.
2. Privileges to members and guests only. Members are responsible for guest conduct. **GUESTS & MEMBERS MUST SIGN IN.** Members may bring guests any day at a cost of \$3 per guest per day. Guests must be with member.
3. No running or pushing in the pool area.
4. Water games permitted with permission from lifeguard on duty.
5. One diver on the board at a time. Diving must be straight out from the board.
6. No non-swimmers allowed in pool area unless with a parent or responsible adult. Babysitters must be 12 years of age or older and must register with the lifeguards.
7. No glass containers or food allowed in the immediate pool area.
8. Lifeguards have full authority over pool activities, including admission, warnings and expulsions.
9. Children not potty trained must wear "potty proof" swimwear. Diaper changing must be done in the Bath House.

 All handicap strokes will be allocated off the low handicap in each match
 Each match will be worth 2 points (2 for win, 1 for tie)
 The team with the most points receives an additional 2 points per match
 **i.e. If team A wins the team match 5-3, they receive 2 more points making it 7-3

MAXIMUM HANDICAP WILL BE SET @ 18 FOR 9 HOLE SCORING. PLAYERS WITH MAXIMUM HANDICAP OF 12 WILL START WITH A POINTS QUOTA OF 0. EXAMPLE: PLAYER WITH 9 HOLE HANDICAP OF 12 WILL NEED TO MAKE A POINTS QUOTA OF 6 POINTS (SCORE 2 NET PARS & 2 NET BOGEYS). ANY ADDITIONAL SCORING WILL BE ADDED TO THE PLAYERS SCORE FOR THE ROUND. TEAM SCORING WILL BE BASED ON THE ACCUMULATED POINTS FOR THE 4 PERSON TEAM DESIGNATED FOR THAT WEEKS MATCH. EXAMPLE: PLAYER A= +6 POINTS.....PLAYER B= +2 POINTS, PLAYER C= -2 POINTS.....PLAYER D= +4 POINTS. TOTAL FOR TEAM= +10 POINTS. MOST POINTS WIN.

GOLF COURSE NEWS

Wow, I never thought that I would wish it to stop raining, but it could quit any time. In two days the golf course received about 6 inches of rain! That equates to roughly 27 million gallons of water, or 216 million pounds of water falling on the golf course in 48 hours. To put that in perspective, that is more water falling on the golf course in 48 hours than we have pumped through the irrigation system in the last two years. It looks like the golf course is not going to suffer permanent damage from the flooding and it is now back to normal.

The abundant rain has also made for perfect growing conditions for the grass. Unfortunately it is so wet that very little mowing is being done and the grass is getting long. As the course dries we will start to get the grass back under control, but some areas will take some time to dry and mow. Your patience is appreciated.

As always about this time of year, the bugs are making their appearance. I remind everyone that bug spray should be applied while on a cart path or out in the rough.

As I mentioned last month, the bunker on #10 is going to be redone, but due to the rain it was put on hold. Hopefully in the coming weeks we will be able to tackle this project.

As always, I hope to see you on the golf course.
