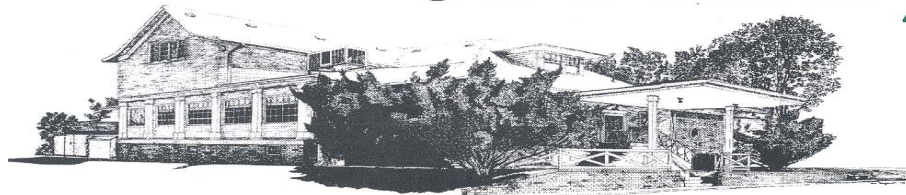

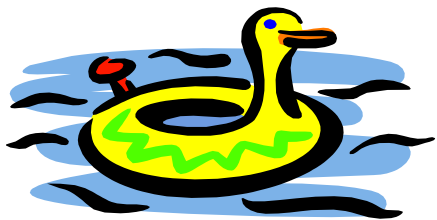

POOL HOURS: MONDAY-SATURDAY 11:00 – 8:00 / SUNDAYS 12:00 – 8:00 (WEATHER PERMITTING)

POOL RULES

1. Swimming pool opens Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day. The pool will open at 11:00 a.m. if the temperature is 65 degrees or above (according to the Weather Channel) at 10:30 am. If not, it will be checked again at 12:00 and if not it will be checked again at 3:30 pm. If the temperature hasn't reached 65 degrees by 3:30 pm the pool will remain closed for the day.
2. Privileges to members and guests only. Members are responsible for guest conduct. GUESTS AND MEMBERS MUST SIGN IN. Members may bring guests any day at a cost of \$3 per guest.
3. No running or pushing in the pool area.
4. Water games permitted with permission from lifeguard on duty.
5. One diver on board at a time. Diving must be straight out from the board.
6. No non-swimmers allowed in pool area unless with a parent of responsible adult. Babysitters must be 12 years of age or older and must register with the lifeguards.
7. No glass containers or food allowed in the immediate pool area.
8. Lifeguards have full authority over pool activities, including admission, warning and expulsions.
9. Children not potty trained must wear "potty proof" swimwear. Diaper changing must be done in the Bath House.



RED CROSS SWIMMING LESSONS

Register at the pool house anytime in June. Registration closes on Friday, June 28. It is important that you sign up BEFORE the first day of class. If we don't have enough students enrolled that level will not be taught. Likewise, if there is a need we will offer two sessions of the same level. Cost is \$20 per child, payable at registration or billed to your club account.

We will give a skill test the first day of lessons and move children as needed. There are handout sheets at the pool house listing what skills your child must have in order to enroll in each level. Also there is a file in the pool house that should show what level your child took last summer at the FDCC pool and if he/she passed. Questions? Call Paula Templemeyer at 955-5563.

Class size: minimum 6 maximum 12

LEVEL 1: 11:00-11:25	Intro to water skills – shallow. Learn to front & back float. At least 4 yrs old.
LEVEL 2: 10:30-10:55	Fundamental skills – shallow. Learn basics of front & back crawl, scissors kick.
LEVEL 2B: 9:30-9:55	If needed (other Level 2 session must be filled.)
LEVEL 3: 10:00-10:25	Stroke development. Learn treading, crawls, butterfly kick, rhythmic breathing.
LEVEL 3B: 11:00-11:25	If needed (other Level 3 session must be filled)
LEVEL 4: 10:30-10:55	Stroke improvement. Learn butterfly, elem backstroke, side stroke & basic diving.
LEVEL 5: 10:00-10:25	Stroke refinement. Breaststroke & work on endurance.
LEVEL 6: 9:30-9:55	2 options: either lifeguard readiness or personal water safety. Both are mostly swimming laps up to 500 yards.

If necessary some upper levels might be combined. Paula Templemeyer, WSI will be managing the lessons. Private lessons may be

- ⇒ NO MORE THAN 2 ADULTS PER CART. YOUNG CHILDREN MAY RIDE WITH ADULTS

IOWA OPEN

FDCC has been given the opportunity to host this year's Iowa Open sponsored by First American Bank.

GOLF COURSE NEWS

As we enter the month of June, kids are getting out of school and the swimming pool is opening. These are sure signs of Summer being right around the corner. With the change in seasons, we should have improved golfing weather. Good days for golf have been few and far between over the past couple of months. Wind has been the main culprit, but we have also had some very wet periods. I hope the next month brings great golf weather.

Fort Dodge Country Club begins to take on a different look this time of year. The rough that has been so thick and penalizing this Spring will start to heat up and dry out. The entire golf course will start to play faster and firmer. The maintenance crew will be at full strength, and the detail trimming and grooming will be getting done on a regular basis. We will also see the signs of an increase in golf traffic. (Ball marks, divots, cart traffic, etc.)

This is also the time of year that the turf is the most stressed. With the Summer heat and humidity comes disease pressure. We have a detailed spray program designed to prevent disease from being able to attack the greens, tees, and fairways. The turf requires more water this time of year as well. I am constantly monitoring the need for irrigation. Our watering system has been operating fairly well so far this year, but some timely rains are still needed to keep the turf in prime condition throughout the Summer.

I would like to take an opportunity to recognize my employees this month. I have an excellent group of individuals working for me. They do a great job of maintaining the Country Club property. I like the fact that they are reliable, hard workers, but I love the way they care about the condition of FDCC. It is very difficult to teach someone to care about what they are doing. Luckily, I don't have that issue with my crew.

I hope to see a lot of members out golfing in the upcoming month. The golf course will be in great shape and waiting for you.
